#### **Croft Rebuild**

Work is well underway on the Croft redevelopment. Walls and windows are being moved, some very large trenches have been dug and residents have a great view of everything that is happening at the moment. Three new rooms are being developed out of existing spaces. Once these have been completed work will start on the additional eleven rooms at the rear of the existing building. While this work is underway staff and visitors need to be mindful

of their surroundings and follow all signage etc. Please remember parking is at a premium between 8am and 5pm Monday to Friday. You may find yourself having to park on the street and walking up to the Croft. As part of the redevelopment there will be additional car parking. In the meantime, we all need to be a bit patient and show some consideration when it comes to parking. Work is on track to be completed by March 2021







### **Refugee Settlement**

PSSC is absolutely delighted and honoured to be the provider for the Refugee Settlement Support Services in Timaru.

This is a natural extension of our mission, vision and values which are centred on supporting those most in need in our community. We already offer a comprehensive range of support services to older people, people with disabilities, children, young people, families/whanau and community.

This project has created four new positions including our new Refugee Settlement Manager, Fiona Jackson. We are currently recruiting for three other newly created positions. The Refugee Settlement team will be located at 3 Sophia Street, Timaru. Aoraki Migrant Centre and English Language Partners will also be residing in this space to create a multicultural hub.



Together we will make a real and positive difference in supporting these families to become part of the Timaru community.

## **Refugee Settlement Services Staff introductions**Refugee Settlement Services Manager:

I was thrilled when I read last year that Timaru had been selected as a new Refugee Settlement location as this is an issue I feel strongly about. When it was announced that Presbyterian Support South Canterbury would be delivering the Refugee Settlement Services in Timaru, I stalked the



website until this position was advertised so that I could convince management of how passionate I was about leading the Refugee Settlement team. My experience working with refugees began when I worked for Australian Immigration for 14 years, in both Australia and overseas managing immigration offices. I have been living in Timaru for 5 years now with my husband (who grew up in Pleasant Point) and our two young kids. And now here I am, with a long list of things to do in order to prepare for the arrival of our new refugee families.

## Health & Wellbeing at PSSC
